

Her initial intent was to raise money so she could buy presents and art supplies for the Children at Greenville Hospital. She had a goal of \$600 to be raised by Christmas to do just this. So how would a girl of her age, 7, go about raising the money for this endeavor? The way many of us would have when we were her age, chores. However even with working all of the chores that Mom and Dad could give her to do she wanted to be able to add more money to the total than what she had. Undoubtedly every year as a child you will receive money from relatives so you can go out and buy what you want. # Kitchen Renovation

Even though the Shrine Center has been quiet over the last year, the RVSC kitchen committee has been hard at work. We have taken an old, worn out kitchen and transformed it into a more modern commercial kitchen that will serve all the Clubs and Units of Kazim.

Gone are the old electric ovens and stove; replaced by gas fired convection ovens and a ten-burner stove. Along with these two appliances a commercial dishwashing system has been added. The kitchen has also been reconfigured so that everything that is needed to put on a meal is at the users' fingertips. Shelves have been added just behind the cooking area, along with an array of cooking utensils. There is now a large assortment of frying pans and a new set of sauce pans with lids. The metal storage cupboards that were in the back of the pantry room have been moved into the kitchen area, sorted and labeled with their contents. The ice machine and single door cooler have been moved together so that the tavernkeepers have easier access to them. There are now two sets of china; one a two-piece setting for 270 people, the other a six-piece setting for 250.

The committee would like to make three acknowledgments. First, to all the nobles who have taken time over the past fifteen months to lend a hand. Your help was always appreciated. Second, to all the Units that donated \$250.00 towards cost of the utilities. Your financial support helped us stick to our overall budget. And finally, to our most important committee member—the late Noble Steve Nelson. Without Steve we would have never been able to accomplish this project. He spent hours working on gas, electrical and plumbing hookups. He gave his technical expertise at every step of the project. At the RVSC April meeting, the Committee saw fit to bring forth a motion to dedicate the kitchen to Steve. The motion passed unanimously.

Finally, we are pleased to announce that the kitchen [with the exception of a few technical things] is ready for the Units to use. One thing that we are planning in the next few weeks is having a "run through" for the Units. What we would like to do is to have one or two members of each unit meet with us some evening so that we can walk everyone through how things work and where everything is stored. We feel that this will be the best way for everybody to understand how things work.

Houston Here We Come

The George R. Brown Convention Center (GRB) has earned accreditation from the Global Biorisk Advisory Council (GBAC) STARTM Facility Accreditation Program – the industry gold standard of safe facilities.

In early September 2020, the GRB became the first convention center in the nation to implement Medistar Corp's new biodefense air filtration system proven to eliminate a number of airborne contaminants, including COVID-19.

Since January 6 of this year, the GRB has successfully welcomed nearly 300,000 attendees at several large events including the Mizuno Cross Court Volleyball Tournament in March. The facility remains active daily, and has hosted up to 21,000 guests in a single day, all while maintaining the highest standards of public safety.

# Additional Safety Measures

The GRB now has 20 EMist 360 electrostatic disinfectant sprayers, which are used at the end of each day to sanitize all common areas throughout the GRB as well as meeting rooms being used during events.

The NUCTECH infrared face temperature screening system FeverBlock provides a non-contact solution for large scene temperature measurement and screening.

- The GRB is part of the Houston Clean initiative, a citywide task force committed to enhanced health precautions designed to mitigate virus spread.
