Kazim Shrine Circus is a go for 2021 right now. We are currently gearing up for ticket sales to begin on September 10th with Salem Civic Center. Cost for this year will be the same as it had been advertised for last year, \$20 adults, \$10 children, and \$5 extra per seat for reserved seating.

Kitchen Clinics

As many of you are aware, the Shrine kitchen has had a makeover during the last eighteen months. We are pleased to announce to the Temple that the kitchen project is now complete and ready to be used by all units and clubs. We have installed gas convection ovens, a ten-burner gas stove and a commercial dishwashing system. Along with these appliances, there have been numerous additions to cooking equipment, utensils, etc. We have also changed the layout of both the kitchen and the adjoining pantry.

With the kitchen being so different, we feel that it is in both our, and your, best interest that we put on a few "kitchen clinics". This will allow us to provide each unit/club a better understanding as to how the appliances work and where things are now stored. These "kitchen clinics" will be held three times in September. All three will be Wednesday nights---September 8, 22, and 29 and will begin each evening at 6:30. It shouldn't take us any more than one hour to explain everything.



A Legacy of Generosity

For nearly 20 years the George and Joyce Headford Charitable Fund has been investing in the lives of children at both the Greenville and Cincinnati Shriners Hospitals. George was a Shriner for 50+ years, first in Ohio and then in Roanoke, Virginia, where he and Joyce settled in the 1970s. They traveled the world together, as Joyce explained it - "I saw parts of the world that I never thought imaginable." They lived life to its fullest and continue to give to the fullest too. As a longtime Shriner, George witnessed the life-changing stories that Shriners Kids continue to share today. As they began giving back to the communities that had been a part of their lives, the decision to support the Greenville and Cincinnati hospitals was an easy one.

Following George's passing in 2007, it was a very good friend of theirs that helped encourage the Charitable Funds continued investments in the Pediatric Orthotics and Prosthetics Services (POPS) department at the Greenville Hospital. "Our longtime friend and trusted adviser, Landon, became ill, and part of his healing and recovery resulted in an amputation and being fitted with a prosthetic leg," shared Joyce. Joyce saw the impact the state-of-the-art prosthetic was having on Landon and his family; when she decided to continue supporting the Greenville Shriners Hospital, she knew exactly what program she wanted to support. "I have heard and read the stories of children using their prosthetics and orthotics to master gymnastics, swimming, golf and playing the violin," Joyce continued. Both the decision to give – and the program to dedicate their support to - were easy ones for Joyce.

George and Joyce used the blessings they experienced during their marriage and life together to invest in the lives of children. George and Joyce's heritage continues today through their Charitable Fund and is creating a legacy of healing in the children and families served by the Greenville Shriners Hospital and its POPS team.

Meet your Imperial Potentate

William S. "Bill" Bailey, 33°, the 2021-2022 Imperial Potentate of Shriners International, and his father, Robert B. Bailey, 33°, Past Imperial Potentate of Shriners International in 1995-1996, are only the second father and son to serve as Imperial Potentates of Shriners International.

As a member of the Board of Directors, Bill Bailey has served as Chairman of Marketing & Communications, Donor Relations, Hospital Operations, Temple Officers Educational Seminars and Temple Procedures. He has also served on the Strategic Planning, Building & Equipment, Membership, Investments, Budget, Insurance Real Estate & Natural Resources, Clinical & Basic Research Committees, and DeMolay, as well as the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open.

He has been hospital liaison to the Erie hospital, the Cincinnati hospital, which is now Shriners Children's Ohio, the Houston hospital, which is now Shriners Children's Texas, the Greenville hospital and the Shreveport hospital, and is currently serving as liaison to both the Twin Cities clinic and the Canada hospital.

For 29 years, Bill Bailey was proud to serve on the Imperial Marshal's Aide Committee, and for 16 of those years, he served as a Vice-Chairman of the Imperial Marshal's Staff.

At the 2005 Imperial Session in Baltimore, Maryland, Imperial Sir Bailey was awarded the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit – the highest honor in the fraternity. The award recognizes outstanding achievement and selfless contributions to Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Bill Bailey is an Emeritus Member of the Iowa Corporation and an emeritus member of the Board of Governors of Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago. He serves as Sovereign of the Red Cross of Constantine, is a member of the Indiana College of Rosicrucians – 8th grade and is a member of DeMolay International, which recently awarded him the DeMolay Legion of Honor.

Bill Bailey is a member of Orak Shriners in Michigan City, Indiana, and served as the temple's Potentate in 2009. He is a member of the Arab Patrol, Motor Patrol, Oriental Band, Sportsman's Club and the South Lake County Shrine Club. He was Director General for the 1987 Great Lakes Shrine Association Business Session in Merrillville, Indiana.

Bill Bailey is a member of Porter Lodge #137 in Valparaiso, Indiana, and a member of the Elbert H. Gary York Rite. He is past Commander in Chief of the South Bend Valley of Scottish Rite, where he was coroneted with a 33rd Degree in 1997.

Outside the Shrine, Bill Bailey has served as a Session Elder for the Ogden Dunes Community Church and is currently a Trustee of the Ogden Dunes Community Church Corporation. He sings in the choir and runs the sound system and livestreaming broadcast.

Bill Bailey served as the Great Banquet Community Lay Leader from 1998-2004, which is an orderly and structured weekend designed to strengthen and renew the faith of Christians. He served for four years on the Ogden Dunes Town Council, including as its President in 1995, and also served as Vice-President of the Ogden Dunes Home Association.

Bill Bailey and his wife, Debby, have been happily married for 44 years and are extremely proud to have two sons, Rob Bailey and Ross Bailey, to follow the family tradition of becoming Shriners. Rob Bailey is married to Jackie, and they have two children, Parker Rose and Beau Owens. Ross is married to Jessica, and they also have two children, Henry Michael and Finn Joseph.

Bill Bailey was born and raised in Ogden Dunes, Indiana, a small lakeside community built on the shores of Lake Michigan, where he and his wife, Debby, currently reside. Bill received his Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Evansville in Indiana and is the third generation in his family to graduate from the university. Bill went on to receive his Master of Science degree from the University of Kentucky.

Bill Bailey is Vice President of Investments for Marcus & Millichap in Chicago, where he sells commercial investment real estate with his brother, John and son, Ross. He is a five-time winner of the Sales Recognition Award.
